



## The WFAA

The Waste Facilities Audit Association (WFAA) was formed in 1993 principally in response to tightening legal environmental requirements, increased cost of waste disposal and increased public and corporate expectation.

The WFAA is a non-profit making association of companies who in the course of their normal business activities generate waste.

### Aims of the WFAA

To assist members in obtaining authoritative information on UK, Irish & mainland Europe waste management facilities through commissioning and sharing independent audits at cost effective rates.

In addition the WFAA also:

- Develops waste management e-learning training materials for its members that can be delivered on CD-ROM or through the member's intranet or Learning Management System.
- Schedules regular workshops and meetings for the member organisations covering waste and related environmental issues.

### Benefits of joining the WFAA

WFAA members have access to comprehensive and expert independent information on UK, Irish and mainland European waste management facilities. The audits are undertaken by international expert environmental consultants at a fixed fee per audit.

The costs of the audit reports are shared among participating members, which allow the overall cost of auditing to be kept to a minimum level. Members save time and resources and encourage and promote best industrial waste management practice.

Regular members meetings and conference/workshop provide a forum for information exchange and include regular updates by environmental legal experts, presentations by guest speakers and technical seminars on subjects of interest to the members.

Members can share and access waste management and other related environmental and management on-line training through the Association's training activities.

### Costs of becoming a member

The WFAA provides a number of membership categories in order to meet the different services required by large international companies, small medium sized enterprises, trade associations and professional bodies.

In addition, the WFAA operates an optional three-year core audit rolling audit programme, which provides each participating member with a minimum number of European & UK audit reports per year. The waste facilities included within the rolling audit programme are reviewed and agreed with the members each year. Further details available from the WFAA Secretary.

Members may also commission additional waste facility audits at a cost shared between the participating members or on a sole sponsorship basis.

Membership fees are detailed below.

<b>Full Member</b> (major organizations)	£1,200 per year
<b>SME Member</b> (Small and medium sized organizations)	£600 per year
<b>Affiliate Member</b> (Professional bodies and trade associations)	£150 per year
<b>NHS Member</b>	£250 per year
<b>Associate Member</b> (Commercial Waste Organisation)	£250 per year

Affiliate & Associate Members do not have access to the WFAA audit programmes.

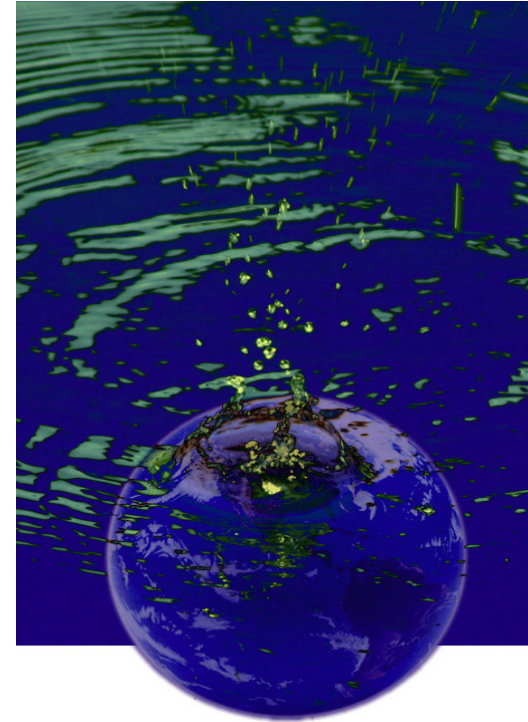
All costs quotes are inclusive of expenses and exclude local taxes.
